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Yamuna River Breaches Danger Mark, Delhi Faces Flood Threat As IMD Forecasts More Showers

Delhi is facing a flood threat due to heavy rainfall in Himachal Pradesh and the release of excess water from the Hathni Kund barrage. This monsoon season, the Yamuna River has crossed the danger mark of 205.33 meters for the third time, raising concerns for the administration. People in low-lying areas are being advised to relocate to safer locations.



Victory of words, New Delhi:

For several days, a large quantity of water has been released from Hathni Kund in Haryana. On Friday, the water release ranged from 60,000 to 80,000 cusecs per hour, contributing to the rising water level in the Yamuna. As a result, more water than before is being released from the Wazirabad barrage in Delhi, causing the water level to rise near the old bridge.The Yamuna River's water level in Delhi continued to rise, reaching 205.33 meters by Friday noon and further increasing to near 205.5 meters by 5 pm. This surge poses a significant threat of flooding in low-lying areas, including Yamuna Bazar and other nearby locations, with homes at risk of being inundated.

Relief Camps Set UP Due To Increasing Water Level
To accommodate those who may need to evacuate, relief camps have been set up at various locations, including the route from Old Yamuna Bridge to Shastri Park Metro Station and areas like Mayur Vihar. Authorities are advising residents in vulnerable areas to move to these relief camps as a precautionary measure.
Yamuna Breaches Danger Mark Third Time
This is the third instance this monsoon season that the Yamuna's water level has crossed the danger mark of 205.33 meters, with the previous occurrences being August 19 and the night of August 27. Officials are closely monitoring the situation and have stated that once the water level reaches 206 meters, a complete evacuation of the low-lying areas will be carried out.
As a precautionary measure, rescue teams equipped with boats have been stationed at 14 locations to ensure timely assistance in case of an emergency. The authorities are working diligently to manage the situation and ensure the safety of residents in affected areas.



Cloudburst in Chennai

Heavy rainfall hit Manali and nearby areas in Chennai on the night of August 30, 2025. The Indian Meteorological Department reported that Manali recorded 10.6 cm of rain between 10 p.m. and 11 p.m., followed by 12.6 cm from 11 p.m. to midnight on August 31. Wimco Nagar experienced the heaviest downpour with 15.7 cm, while Korattur received 13.7 cm and New Manali Town saw 10.3 cm during the same period.

Rainfall Impact Across Chennai

In a span of 24 hours ending at 8:30 a.m. on August 31, Manali accumulated a total of 27 cm of rain. New Manali Town and Wimco Nagar were not far behind, recording 26 cm and 23 cm respectively. Other parts of Chennai also faced significant rainfall, with Kathivakkam and Tiruvottiyur receiving 13.6 cm and 12.6 cm respectively.

Ayapakkam registered a rainfall of 12.1 cm during this period, while Parrys and Ambattur recorded slightly lower figures at 11.5 cm and 11.2 cm respectively.

Nerkundram, Ambattur, and CD Hospital Tondiarpet saw rainfall measurements of 11 cm, 10 cm, and 10.2 cm respectively.

Flight Diversions Due to Weather

The heavy rains caused disruptions at Chennai airport as well, leading to the diversion of three flights to Bengaluru. Flights originating from Frankfurt, Mangaluru, and New Delhi were unable to land in Chennai due to the adverse weather conditions.

Kolathur and Ayanavaram Taluk Office recorded rainfall amounts of 9.6 cm each, while Kasimedu received slightly less at 9.5 cm and Valasarawakkam at 9.1 cm. Several other areas such as Puzhal, Perambur, Aminjikarai, Chembambakkam, Red Hills, Anna Nagar West, Thamaraiakkam, and Okkiyam Thoraipakkam also experienced substantial rainfall.

India's Place in the Age of Artificial Intelligence

Artificial Intelligence (AI) is reshaping the world in every sector —healthcare, education, agriculture, industry, and governance. For India, this is not just a new technology but a unique chance to rise as a global leader in the digital era. The AI industry in India is expanding at a fast pace. In 2024, it was valued at about 1.25 billion dollars, and experts predict it may touch nearly 17 billion dollars by 2027. India also has one of the largest pools of technology professionals, with over 4.2 lakh people working in AI-related areas.

At the same time, challenges remain. A recent statement by FICCI pointed out that India is not able to fully seize global opportunities in AI because of a lack of experts and the absence of proper academic curriculum. While India has talent, it is not being trained in the right way. Our education system has not yet fully included AI and Machine Learning in its mainstream courses. Unless AI becomes a regular part of engineering, management, and even basic science studies, India may lag behind. This is a crucial warning that India must act on immediately.

The government has already taken steps in this direction. In 2024, it announced a 1.25-billion-dollar plan under the IndiaAI Mission to strengthen AI infrastructure, fund startups, and create India's own large-language models. There is also a target to train nearly 5 lakh Indians in AI skills by 2026, along with building AI labs across the country. These steps are positive, but they must be matched with reforms in our educational curriculum so that graduates are ready for AI-driven jobs.

AI startups are growing rapidly in India. By mid-2025, there are more than 890 AI startups, making India the second-largest hub in the world for new AI companies. These startups are working on language translation tools, healthcare solutions, fintech innovations, and farming technologies. They show how AI can directly touch the lives of ordinary people. In rural India, AI can help farmers with weather predictions and crop planning. In schools, it can bring personalized learning. In hospitals, it can help detect diseases at an early stage.

But AI also comes with risks. If not guided carefully, it may replace human jobs, misuse personal data, and increase inequality. India must adopt strict laws and ethical standards to ensure AI is used responsibly.

International cooperation is also important. While the US and China are far ahead in AI research and investment, India can build partnerships with Japan, Europe, and other democratic nations, while also strengthening its own domestic capacity.

India today stands at a turning point. With its young population and growing digital economy, it has the right foundation to become a major AI power. But this will be possible only if our academic system produces experts, our policies encourage innovation, and our safeguards protect society. If India rises to this challenge, the AI revolution can truly become an "India moment."

Teen drowns in Peddavagu rivulet, two friends rescued in Asifabad

Victory of words, Kumram downstream from the Bheem Asifabad: A 17-year-old boy drowned in the Peddavagu rivulet near Asifabad on Sunday, while two of his friends were rescued by a tractor driver. His body was later retrieved from the stream. Police said Shaik Mahabub of Asifabad town, along with his friends Ayan and Rehan, entered the rivulet to take a dip. As they were swept away by the current, a tractor driver nearby rushed to their rescue and managed to bring them ashore after hearing their cries for help. On receiving information, police reached the spot and deployed expert divers to trace Mahabub. His body was recovered about 500 metres downstream from the site of the incident. A case was registered following a complaint lodged by the victim's father. The investigation is under way. In another incident in Sangareddy, a 30-year-old man, identified as Mohammed Lathif of Manoor mandal on Sunday, along with his friends Mohammad, Sudhir, Sandeep and Adnan, had gone to the lake for fishing when he accidentally slipped into the water. The others immediately alerted local officials, who launched a rescue operation to trace him.



BRS dumps Ghose Commission report in dustbin, vows to continue legal, political fight

Calling the Justice PC Ghose Commission report on the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Project (KLIP) a trash document, BRS working president KT Rama Rao vowed to continue both a legal and political fight against the Congress government's conspiracy with the BJP to permanently close down Telangana's lifeline project. The BRS staged a walkout from the Assembly late on Sunday night, protesting against the denial of speaking time during the debate on the PC Ghose Commission report on the Kaleshwaram project. Led by Rama Rao and senior MLA T Harish Rao, the BRS MLAs marched to Gun Park in protest. At the Telangana Martyrs' Memorial, they threw the Ghose Commission report into a dustbin, calling it a trash document, and raised slogans against the government. Speaking on the occasion, Rama Rao alleged that the Commission was politically motivated, aimed at tarnishing the reputation of the previous BRS government including that of former Chief Minister K Chandrashekhara Rao and Harish Rao, while helping Andhra Pradesh in water diversion.

He accused Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy of misleading people ahead of the local body polls and vowed that BRS would fight both legally and politically, with constituency-level awareness campaigns if required. Stating that both the Congress and the BJP were complicit, he questioned why there was no commission or inquiry on the SLBC tunnel collapse, Vattem pumphouse submergence, Sunkishala retaining wall collapse and when the Peddavagu project was washed away twice? He reminded that the NDSA, which found fault with the Kaleshwaram project for minor repairs, was ignoring the SLBC tunnel collapse or Polavaram project incident despite severe damages. "People of Telangana are smarter and will teach a befitting lesson to both BJP and Congress," he added. Harish Rao accused Congress of ignoring real issues like floods and urea shortage, but instead choosing to discuss the Ghose Commission report. He said while failing to construct a single project in two years, the Congress was taking credit for BRS's work. He dared Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka to prove his claim that no new irrigation ayacut was created under the BRS rule or resign from his post.

Hyderabadi woman kills three children, attempts suicide in Saudi Arabia

A Hyderabad woman allegedly killed her three children and later attempted suicide in Al Khobar city, Saudi Arabia, on Tuesday. The woman, identified as Syeda Humera Amreen, a native of Mohammadi Lines (MD Lines) in Tolichowki, Hyderabad, allegedly drowned her twin sons, Sadeq Ahmed and Adel Ahmed (7), and her younger son Yousuf Ahmed (3), in a bathtub at their residence. After killing the children, she is said to have tried to end her life, according to family sources. Her husband, Mohammed Shahnawaz, returned home from work in the evening and was shocked to find the children dead. He immediately alerted the local police. The woman and her children were in Saudi Arabia on a visit visa. Family members said she was suffering from mental health issues and loneliness, while sources also indicated that there had been family disputes. The exact reasons behind the incident are yet to be ascertained. Saudi police have taken up the investigation.

Revanth Reddy's decision for CBI probe into

Kaleshwaram issue surprises his Cabinet colleagues



Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy on Sunday appeared to demonstrate his claim of being '100 percent autonomous' by announcing a CBI probe into alleged irregularities in the Kaleshwaram project, a move that caught his own Cabinet colleagues by surprise. Although the Cabinet had met on Saturday, sources said there was no discussion on involving the CBI in the Kaleshwaram issue. Revanth's announcement not only startled his colleagues but also ran contrary to Congress leader Rahul Gandhi's repeated charge that the BJP-led Centre was misusing Central agencies like the CBI to target the Opposition.

In effect, Revanth did what Rahul

Gandhi had accused the BJP of doing. While he told the Assembly that he was acting in line with Rahul Gandhi's directions, Sunday's move indicated otherwise. The CBI probe decision also comes at a time when opposition parties have been disputing the PC Ghose Commission report, flagging several issues. The BRS has already dismissed the report as politically motivated, warning that its "speculative" observations could have far-reaching consequences. According to the party, the report could weaken Telangana's rightful claim to Godavari waters and give neighbouring States an advantage in water-sharing disputes. The CBI probe, meanwhile, is likely to further delay the already stalled repairs of the Medigadda Barrage, which could have a cascading negative effect on Telangana's agriculture sector, worsening the problems of an already distressed farming community.

Kaleshwaram project not collapsed, tenders expose govt's hollow stand, says Harish Rao

Victory of words, Hyderabad: Exposing what he termed as false claims of the Congress government on the Kaleshwaram project, former Minister T Harish Rao said the National Dam Safety Authority (NDSA) had clarified that restoration of Block VII of Medigadda barrage would be taken up after receiving results of investigations and expert committee opinions, and the barrage would continue to remain operational. Replying to a question raised by Professor Kodandaram in the Legislative Council on whether Sundilla and Annaram barrages could collapse, Irrigation Minister N Uttam Kumar Reddy had said they would not, thereby confirming their stability, Harish Rao pointed out. Intervening, Uttam Kumar Reddy said the NDSA, suspecting the strength of the foundations, had directed that water should not be stored in the barrages. "If you cannot store water, then what is the purpose of an irrigation project?" he asked.

He criticised the Congress government for alleging a collapse of the project while simultaneously floating tenders worth Rs.7,000 crore to bring water to Hyderabad. He added that Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy himself laid the foundation for the Gandamalla reservoir, which would receive water from Mallanna Sagar, a component of Kaleshwaram. "When there are good rains, we don't use Medigadda and operate pumps from Mid Manair. The government has to calculate the water sourced from this point," he said. He noted that in an average year, pumps were operated only from Yellampally and not always from Medigadda, stressing the government could not mislead people by projecting water drawn from Medigadda alone. The former Minister recalled that the BRS government had spent Rs.252 crore on Yellampally and Rs.1,586 crore on Mid Manair. He reminded that during the Congress government's tenure, the Yellampally right side earth bund was washed away in 2009, the Palem vagu project in Warangal was washed away in 2008 and 2009, the Kadem project was damaged in its very first year in 1958, and 80 dams across the country have suffered damages. "Though Palem vagu collapsed during the Congress tenure, the BRS government did not constitute any commission. It was restored and water was given to people in 2017," Harish Rao said. As the Speaker urged him to conclude, Harish Rao remarked that he was interrupted 30 times by different Ministers. "I think they decided in the cabinet to interrupt me repeatedly," he said.
